
Wm. Leenders of Chicago Heights transacted business here on Friday.

FOREIGN TRADE CORPORATION

CHICAGO, Dec. 11.—Organization here today of a hundred million dollar trade corporation with a credit capacity of \$1,000,000,000 for financing foreign trade was assured at the meeting of bankers, manufacturers, farmers and general business representatives began the second day of its session.

Former Secretary of Commerce Wm. D. Redfield was in the foreground today as a strong possibility as president for the corporation, which is to be formed under the Edge law, and amendment of the federal revenue act. Herbert Hoover, likewise, is being discussed as a possible head for the organization.

Capital stock in the new corporation under the plan generally favored would be subscribed by banks and industrial corporations.


