

GEORGES CARPENTIER AND FRANK MORAN TO MEET IN LONDON RING

LONDON, Dec. 12.—Georges Carpentier, heavyweight champion of Europe, has practically consented to meet Frank Moran in a twenty round bout to a decision here next February. The managers of the men already have reached a tentative agreement, and articles are expected to be signed within a few days.

Moran probably will sign a contract tomorrow to meet Bombardier Wells here in January. The Carpentier-Moran match will hinge on the outcome of the Moran-Wells contest. If Wells should beat Moran he will be substituted for the American against Carpentier.

Every indication, however, is that Moran, who showed splendid form against Beckett last Friday, will knock Wells out.

The Carpentier-Moran match is virtually rendered necessary through Moran's recent knockout of Beckett. Practically made it imperative that Carpentier should dispose of Moran before the Frenchman meets Jack Dempsey for the world's title. Moran will have many backers when he goes into the ring against the French champion.

FEDERAL RESERVE IS CRITICIZED

WASHINGTON, Dec. 12.—The federal reserve system is not operating as it was intended to operate, Senator Borah, republican, Idaho, declared in the senate today. "It is operating under the beneficent influence of certain international banking interests which control the financial situation in this country."

Borah said the country banks now had \$1,377,466,000 on deposit with the federal reserve banks in six of the country's principal cities.
