Solicitors have been about in the Twin Cities the past week disposing of child welfare literature for an institution in New York. East Chicago-Indiana Harbor has a child welfare project of its own which deserves the greatest support and it would seem that New York could amply take care of its own institutions of that nature. Now that a home is to be built in the interests of child welfare in the Twin Cities, it will take a great effort on the part of the people of the community to maintain it adequately and these desiring to build a most worthy cause are beset to contribute the money that is spent on out-of-town non-essentials to our own community, in the home institutions. 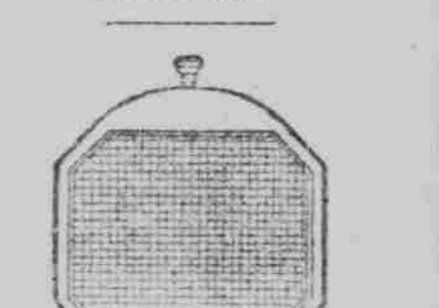
Mrs. Elizabeth Bruckmiller is leaving to spend the holidays with her mother, a resident of Garrett, Ind.

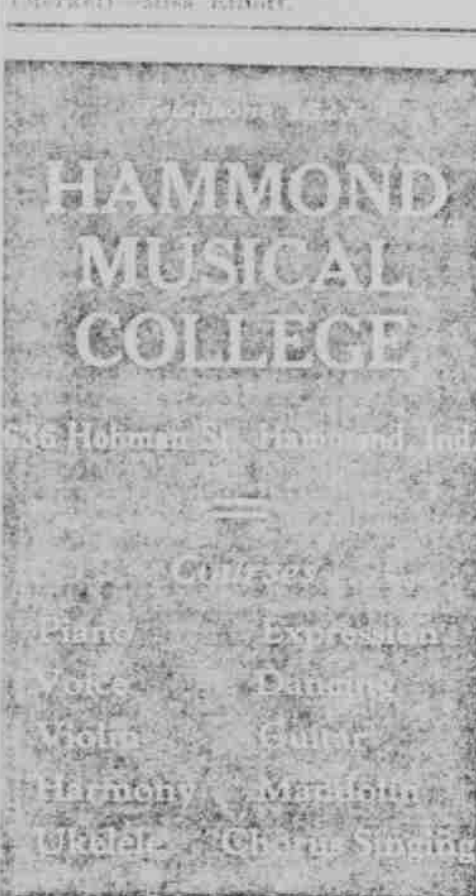

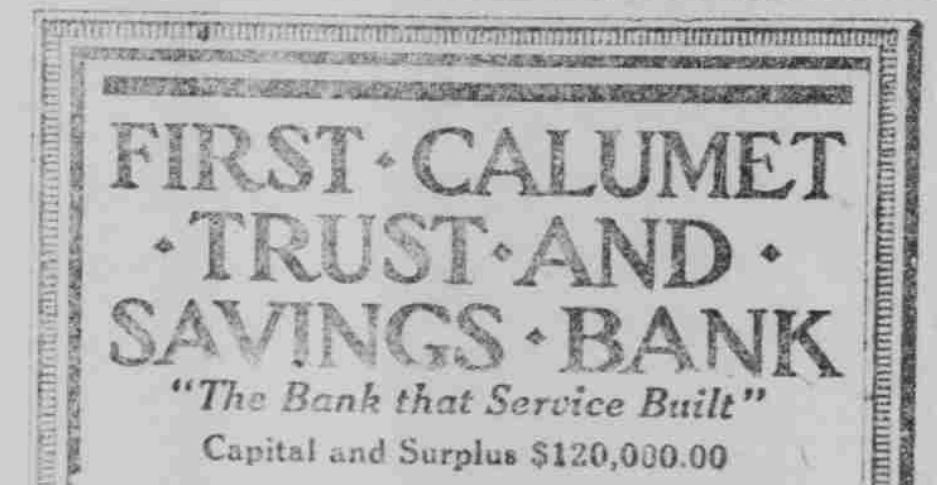


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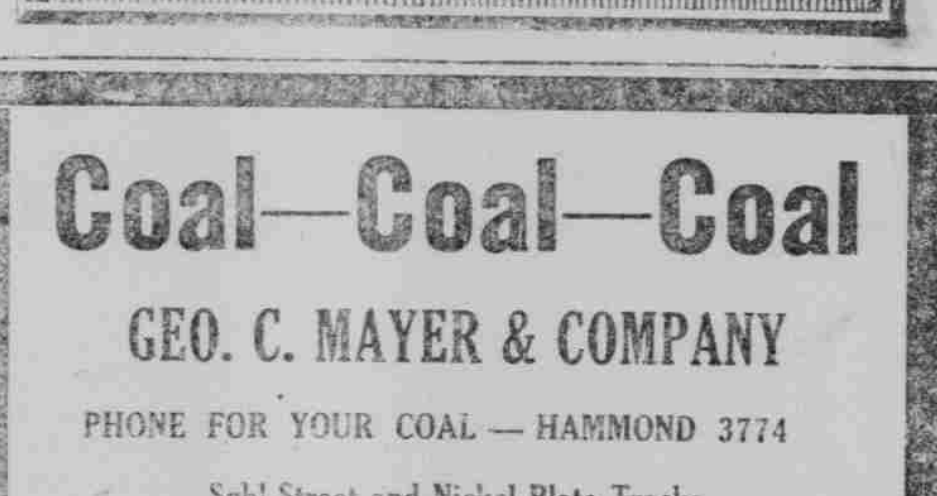
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
