WILLARD EXPECTS TO TRAIN THREE MONTHS

KANSAS CITY, MO., Dec. 18.—Jess Willard, former heavyweight champion, expects to train intensively 3 months in preparation for his bout to regain the title from Jack Dempsey in New York, March 17, according to a statement made here by Ray Archer, his manager.

Archer came to Kansas City from Lawrence, Kan., the home of the former champion, to confer with Hugh Walker, a heavyweight, concerning the employment of Walker as one of Willard's sparring partners. Walker will meet Capt. Bob Roper, heavyweight of the American Expeditionary Forces, in a bout here December 30.

Discussing the coming bout with Dempsey Archer said: "Willard isn't thinking about money."
