

PANAMA DIPLOMAT
ASKS U. S. AID IN
PREVENTING WAR

Belisario Porras, president of Panama, has issued a call for volunteers anticipating war with Costa Rica, the neighboring Central American republic. Costa Rica has sent troops into the Panamanian district of Coto, territory which Costa Rica claims under the Loubet award of 1890. Chargé d'affaires Le Fevre of the Panama legation called on the good offices of the United States to prevent the threatened bloodshed of his government and Costa Rica. Whether the request was authorized or not is not known. An attempt was made recently to assassinate President Porras.

MR. SCHULTZ OBJECTS

Charles H. J. Schultz of Lansing objects to the unfavorable light in which he was placed by the account of the accident which occurred Thursday evening at Standard avenue and Garfield street, Hammond, in which John Huizinga of Highland was injured. Mr. Schultz wishes it made clear that he was on the right side of the street and that the Monon bus which was coming from the west, was on the wrong side of the road and turned onto Garfield street without signaling. Huizinga on his motorcycle was immediately behind the bus and likewise on the wrong side of the street. Schultz says he stopped within ten feet and that the motorcycle crashed into his car.

SUES FOR DAMAGES

Franklin J. White of Hammond has filed suit for damages against Albert Wall of Hobart. The complaint which was filed today in the Hammond superior court by Attorney M. M. Bruce states that on Dec. 5, Mr. Wall permitted his 14-year-old son to drive his car to Hammond. The boy on the way home drove east on Highland street and at Calumet avenue collided with the car of Mr. White. The plaintiff asks for \$279 damages.

WILL INVITE UNITED STATES

PARIS, March 2.—The United States is invited to participate in the next meeting of the League of Nations council to discuss mandates in the League's reply to the American mandate note which was made public here today. The note points out that the United States was one of the leading participants in the war and peace negotiations, but that America must recognize the fact that the situation has been complicated by the fact that the United States has not ratified the treaty nor joined the League of nations.


