

# BABY FOUND IN WHITING

WHITING, Ind., July 7.—Whiting has a homeless little girl baby and the police are trying to locate the mother. Yesterday morning when Joe Bubala went out on the front

porch of his home at 712 Euclid avenue, he found the child wrapped in a few articles of clothing and lying near his door. He notified the police who turned the little one over to the Whiting Children's hospital. She is apparently three months old and in perfect health. No clue to the child's identity could be found on the clothing.

# U. S. APPROVAL OF ILLIANO HARBOR LAW IS ASKED

Acting in accordance with laws passed by the Illinois and Indiana state legislatures providing for an interstate harbor commission to work out plans for Illiano harbor at Wolf lake, Hammond, Col. William V. Judson, government engineer for the Chicago district, has asked Washington for approval of the general objects of the commission.

Both the Indiana and Illinois laws provide for a commission of five members, two to be appointed by the governor of Illinois, two by the governor of Indiana, and the fifth to be named by the secretary of war and the chief of federal engineers.

Whether federal legislation will be necessary for the approval of the compact between the two states and for the appointment of the federal member of the commission are questions which Col. Judson has asked his superior officers in Washington to answer.

City Attorney W. W. McMahon will go before the Public Service Commission tomorrow to obtain approval of the bond issue which is expected to be placed without a hitch. Engineer Erickson has prepared complete plans and specifications of the proposed improvements and these will be placed before the board.

As soon as the bond issue is approved orders will be placed for the new equipment and excavation and construction work preparatory to the installations can be started.

# RAILROADS TO GET HALF BILLION

(INTERNATIONAL NEWS SERVICE)  
WASHINGTON, July 7.—The United States will have to pay approximately \$500,000,000 to the American railroads in addition to the money already paid as the result of government control during the war, Secretary of the Treasury Mellon said today.

The secretary stated he might find it necessary to ask congress for an additional appropriation of \$500,000,000 to meet the claims of the railroads.

The money which is yet to be paid to the railroads is chiefly for claims of various sorts and is in addition to the guaranty money and reimbursements which have already been appropriated for.

# HAS TO MAKE QUICK COURTSHIP

COLUMBUS, Ind., July 7.—Louis E. Runshe has until Saturday to try to win back the love of his wife in a second courtship. When Oma Runshe appealed to Judge Donaker in the circuit court for support money pending disposition of her appeal for divorce, Runshe wept and told the court he loves his wife and wants to continue living with her. Judge Donaker then instructed Runshe to woo his wife as "ardently and sincerely with care and in words of endearment as you did

when you both were younger, adding that, he felt that Runshe would win her back to himself and his home.

# DEATH OF MRS. A. J. MILLER

The brief message which came to Hammond yesterday, announcing the sudden death of Mrs. A. J. Miller at Connersville, Ind., came as a distinct shock to her host of friends in Hammond.

Mrs. Miller was for a number of years one of the most prominent women of the city in club circles and educational affairs. She was a teacher in the public schools and was possessed of a brilliant intellect which caused her opinions to be sought on many subjects.

Several years ago Mrs. Miller moved to Connersville following the separation between her and her husband, Dr. A. J. Miller, who still resides in Hammond. Friends had been in communication with her and were surprised when the brief message announcing her death was received by her son, John Ralston Miller. The young man left at once for Connersville to attend the funeral which was held this forenoon.
