**U. S. APPROVAL OF
ILLINOIS HARBOR
LAW IS ASKED**

Acting in accordance with laws passed by the Illinois and Indiana state legislatures providing for an interstate harbor commission to work out plans for Illinois harbor at Wolf lake, Hammond, Col. William V. Judson, government engineer for the Chicago district, has asked Washington for approval of the general objects of the commission.

Both the Indiana and Illinois laws provide for a commission of five members, two to be appointed by the governor of Illinois, two by the governor of Indiana, and the fifth to be named by the secretary of war and the chief of federal engineers.

Whether federal legislation will be necessary for the approval of the compact between the two states and for the appointment of the federal member of the commission are questions which Col. Judson has asked his superiors in Washington to answer.

**NEW BOND
ISSUES PROPOSED**

The deck is practically cleared for starting the long delayed project of increasing the capacity of Hammond's water system. Last night the city council in an adjourned meeting passed the ordinance authorizing the Board of Works to issue bonds against the city for \$800,000.

The issue will be serial bonds bearing 8 per cent interest and it is required that they sell at par or over. They are backed by the city in preference to the private corporation plan which had been considered. It is believed that they will sell readily as they are non-taxable whereas the bonds issued by a private corporation would be taxable and hence not so attractive even though they brought as high as 8 per cent interest. This will still be within the city's 2 per cent limit for bonding so it is a safe bet that no administration within the next fifteen or twenty years will be able to run the city farther in debt for it will be only as these bonds are retired that the city will have the power to issue new bonds except as the tax valuations rise above the present figures.

thirty years and will be retired as follows:

The bonds will all have matured in \$15,000 per year for the first five years.
\$20,000 per year for the second five years.
\$25,000 per year for the third five years.
\$30,000 per year for the fourth five years.
\$35,000 per year for the fifth five years.
\$38,000 per year for the sixth five years.

City Attorney W. W. McMahon will go before the Public Service Commission tomorrow to obtain approval or the bond issue which is expected to go through without a hitch. Engineer Erickson has prepared complete plans and specifications of the proposed improvements and these will be placed before the board.

As soon as the bond issue is approved orders will be placed for the new equipment and excavation and construction work preparatory to the installations can be started.

**RAILROADS TO
GET HALF BILLION**

WASHINGTON, July 7.—The United States will have to pay approximately \$300,000,000 to the American railroads in addition to the money already paid as the result of government control during the war, Secretary of the Treasury Mellon said today.

The secretary stated he might find it necessary to ask congress for an additional appropriation of \$300,000,000 to meet the claims of the railroads.

The money which is yet to be paid to the railroads is chiefly for claims of various sorts and is in addition to the guaranty money and reimbursements which have already been appropriated for.
