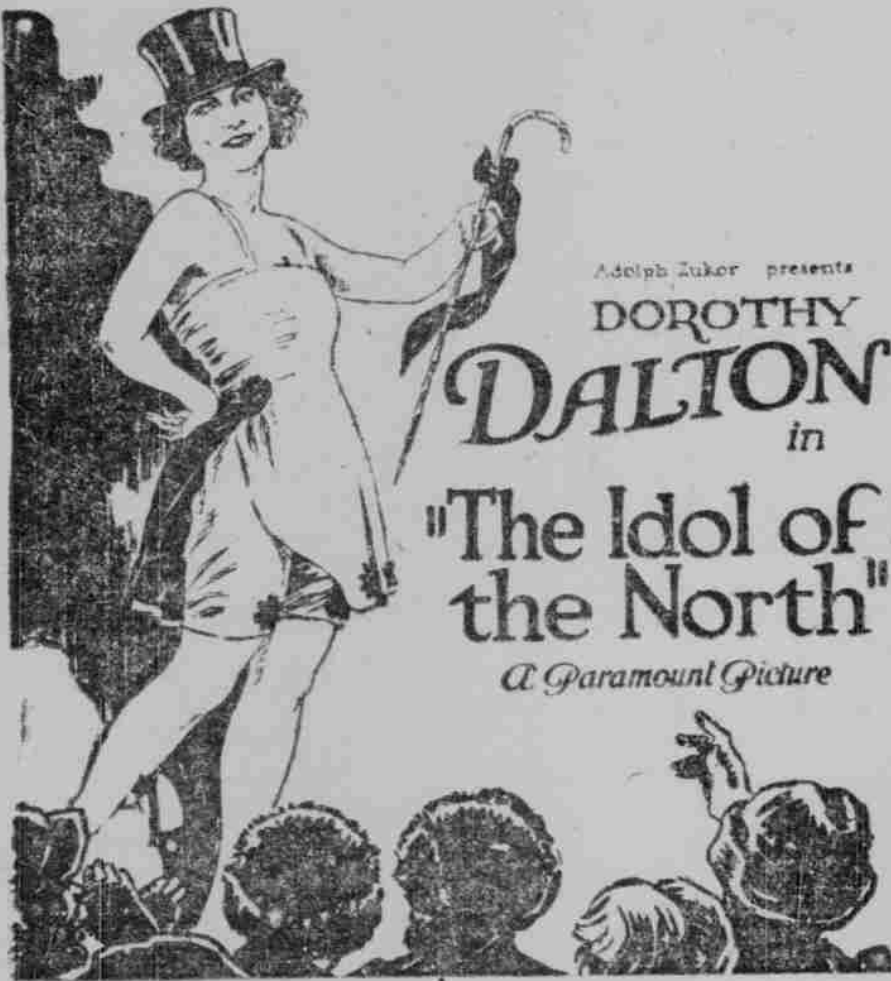

AN EXPLANATORY LETTER

The following letter was received by City Commissioner Parks from the State Tax Commissioners:

"Mr. P. A. Parks, City Comptroller, East Chicago, Ind.
"Dear Sir—Your letter addressed to Mr. Harrison has been referred to me, and in reply will say that if the \$150,000 has been issued by order of the city council ordinance, regularly adopted, and if this amount is to be paid out of revenue to be collected this year, reasons for which tax levies has already been made, it will be considered a temporary loan and the approval of this board is not required in cases of this kind.

"The attorney general has so ruled and if your banks hesitate in any way to take these time warrants, we would be glad to write each a letter stating to them that the approval of this board is not required. It is only where bonds or certificates of indebtedness are issued that are not paid out of existing levies, but are paid in a series of either one, two, three or four years, whatever the case may be. The statute itself defines a temporary loan as one that is issued in anticipation of revenue already levied.

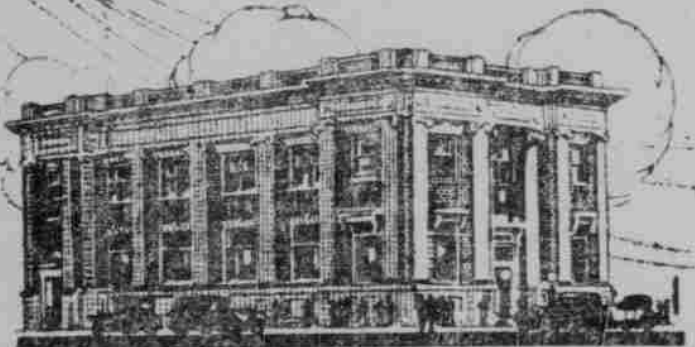
