The Guard Organization Now Has a Total of Forty-three Members.

Lee Curban, L. George and Theodore Hunt are the three recruits which have signed up with Company H, since yesterday. Captain Stagle with a detail of men made a recruiting trip to Sheridan and vicinity yesterday and two of the three men were added as a result of that trip.

Preparations are now being made for the company to move within the next few hours. Orders were received to move this morning and the destination given but the latter will not be known through the press. Although the company is short of men, the entire membership being only forty-three, it is one of the best in the state, nevertheless. As soon as the transportation arrives and baggage and personal effects are sent here the company will leave. The time for departure is not known but will be in the next few days. The men were here all day getting the necessary things to move on a temporary basis and very little time will be lost when the order is given to go.

The Cemetery

Amidst the suggestion of voluntary citizenship made by Adjutant General Harry L. Smith, at the Indiana national guard, the Republic will refrain from publication of all information, concerning the time of departure of troops from their home stations or their arrival at any given destination.

The regulations have been prepared for the protection of the troops and all citizens will be following the same plan as in the handling of soldiers. The newspapers all have followed every suggestion offered in the past and I have no doubt about having their cooperation in the future.
