FARMERS ASSOCIATION NEWS.

What the Township Organizations are
Doing to Advance Public
Interest.

According to W. H. Favinger, president
of the County Federation the
farmer organizations in the different
townships are rapidly growing.
The Noble County Big Type Poland
China Breeders association elected
the following officers for the coming
year: J. B. Growcock, president; Joe
Seaburg, first vice president; S. S.
Steele, second vice president; Wm.
Todd, third vice president; Fred
Spurgeon, secretary-treasurer. The
association voted to hold four meet-
ings a year and appointed a committee
to take charge of them as follows:
S. S. Steele, Chas. Lemmon and For-
est Parker. The association has 25
members and is prosperously active.

The Duroc Jersey Club com-
mited met Friday evening and accepted sev-
eral applications into the Duroc Jersey
Pig Feeding club. The club mem-
bership is limited to ten boys and girls
and is filled. Good feeding barrows
will be purchased for the young feed-
ers as soon as the pigs are old enough
to wean.

The certified Early Ohio Potatoes
bought by members through the pure
eggs division have been received and
are very satisfactory. They were pur-
chased of a farmer in Wisconsin and
cost the members three dollars and
forty-five cents, delivered. The Asso-
ciation is negotiating for one hundred
bushels of certified Irish coblers raised
in Minnesota. If obtained they will
cost between four and five dollars per
bushel.

The Farmers' association has ordered
six thirty-ton cars of limestone for
members. The price is \$2.05 per ton
delivered.

Treat the oats for smut. It will

diseases such as black scurf, etc., as
well. For this reason it is better than
formaldehyde.

Skip and cover plowing is the ex-
