FARM ORGANIZATION NEWS.

The first issue of the Noble County Farmer is out. It is published by a Kendallville job office and is the official organ of the Noble County Farmer Organizations.

Food is absolutely necessary. More than a hundred millions of people in the United States must be fed while, in addition, many millions in Europe must have food from American farms. People of the cities must realize that farmers must have a fair price for their products. Cheap land and cheap labor have gone and so the last of cheap food has been seen. From now on, consumers must pay a price that will give a fair return for the farmers' labor and his investment. Under the conditions, if wheat was worth \$2.20 per bushel in 1917, the crop of 1920 should bring not less than \$3.00. If corn was worth 80c in 1914, the 1920 crop should return \$1.75 to \$2.00 per bushel. Prices for other crops, for live stock, dairy, and poultry products, should be increased accordingly. Food production should be maintained, but this can only be hoped for when farmers are assured of reasonable prices. The situation demands the serious and careful consideration of all the people.

The next meeting of the Elkhart farmers organization will be held at Cosperville the second Wednesday in May.

It is said that farmers raise more corn to feed more hogs to buy more land to raise more corn to feed more hogs, etc. while labor calls more strikes to get more wages to call more strikes, to get more wages, etc. Take your choice for national welfare.

Motor Clubs complain of excessive charges by farmers for pulling cars out of the mud but what have they to say of tourists who when pulled out of mud throw into "high" and "beat it" without even a "thank-you"? Do they do it? Ask the farmers.

Railroads build road beds for steam trains to haul freight over. Is it right that the public should build road beds for truck trains to haul freight over?

The Wolverine Oats purchased by members through the Pure Seed Division have proved to be quite satisfactory so far. They easily average three bushels to the sack. Their growth and development will be watched with much interest. The Wolverine variety was bred by plant specialists of the Michigan Agricultural College. They have made good in that State.
