

To Fight Chinch Bugs.  
Farmers of Noble county are experiencing trouble with chinch bugs this year and every precaution is being taken to check the progress of the pests which have done thousands of dollars of damage to the wheat and corn the past few years. B. V. Widney, of Albion county agricultural agent stated the presence of the bugs have been noticed in every township in the county and are laying eggs in the wheat.

Creosote is practically the only preventative from keeping the bugs from the corn and farmers are warned to provide themselves with the oil if they find bugs in their field.
