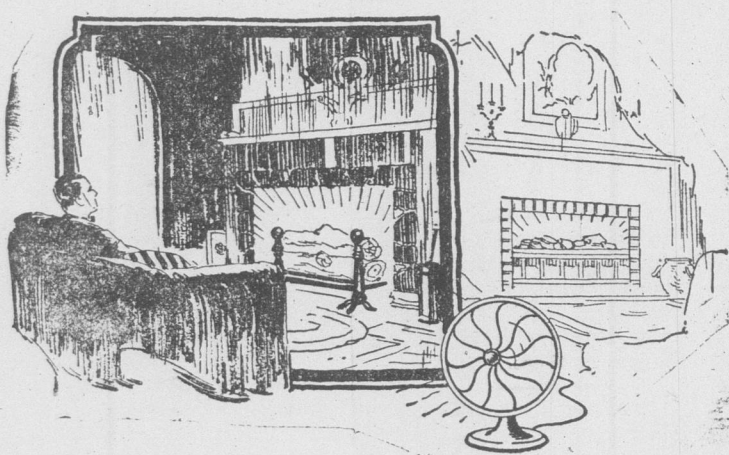

Horse Thief Detectives Manacled.

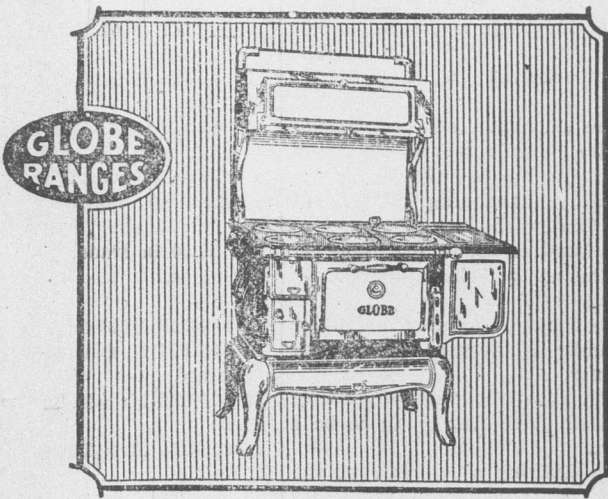
