

#### New Ford Record

The Ford Motor company's production record moved up to a higher peak than ever during the last week. Figures given out by the company Saturday afternoon showed that for the week of October 17-23 the domestic production totaled 49,004 cars and trucks a record for any six-day period.

The biggest day for the week which reached a new record was last Tuesday when 8,465 cars and trucks were produced.

#### Middlebury Schools Closed.

The Middlebury school and the Greiner school a short distance west of Middlebury were closed for fumigation in an effort to stop any further spread of scarlet fever. There are five cases of scarlet fever in Middlebury township all outside of the town of Middlebury, it was reported to County Health Commissioner Dr. H. K. Lemon of Goshen. There are also two cases of diphtheria in the town.

#### Oppose Dance Hall.

A big dance hall to operate on Sunday nights and on nights throughout the summer and fall months within a short distance of the Winona Assembly and Summer School Park entrance is planned by Samuel Farrell of Wabash. The land embraced Winona Lake shore property formerly occupied by the Winona ice house and the farm further west along the lake shore. Winona people are protesting against the plan.

#### Golden Eagle Captured.

A golden eagle with a wing spread of more than seven feet was captured alive in a corn field near Columbus.

The eagle was captured by John Holder of Hawcreek township when he found the bird in a field where it had descended to capture a chicken.

Unable to spread its wings because of the closeness of the corn rows the bird was knocked over the head with an ear of corn.

#### Motor Car Production.

Almost half of the automobile sales during September were financed on the deferred payment plan, according to the monthly report of the Seventh Federal Reserve district bank of Chicago. Forty retail firms reported that 48.7 per cent of all sales were deferred payments.

Motor car production during September was 262,000, an increase of 22.3 per cent over August and of 2 per cent over September a year ago.

Manufacturers are beginning to stock up their dealers with new cars, the bank reports, basing its deduction on data furnished by firms producing 52.7 per cent of the total September output.

The Seventh district comprises Michigan, Indiana, Illinois, Iowa and Wisconsin. It has a large part of the motorcar production area of the country.
