**Released From Contracts**

The Board of Directors of the "Dara Tobacco Growers Co-operative Pool of Kentucky" through a resolution presented by their General Counsel, Aaron Sapiro, and adopted by them have released the 70,000 members of the pool from their contract with the Association for this year and stated that they would not take legal action to force the members to deliver their product to the Association. At the same meeting many offices were abolished and drastic salary cuts made in others, which will save the Association \$150,000.00 yearly. Mr. Sapiro General Counsel of the Association is the author of the Indiana Wheat Pool Bill.

**Democrats to Use "Paster Ballots".**
