Republican Victory. DAVENPORT, April 2, 1864. Robert Lowrey, Republican, was elected Mayor to-day by nine hundred and sixty-five majority. A handsome gain. DAVENPORT, April 2.—Our annual municipal election took place to-day. All passed off quietly. The entire Republican city ticket is elected. R. Lowrey having about 1,000 majority for Mayor, and the other city officers from 500 to 600 majority, a large gain over last year. The six Republican nominees for Aldermen are elected. The six Aldermen holding over are Republicans. In the 5th Ward a combination of the opposition defeated G. S. Dow, the Republican nominee, by five majority. The successful candidate was formerly a Republican, but it is not known what he is now. In the 6th Ward a similar combination caused a tie.

Down. The martyred Vallandigham does not seem to get as much sympathy as we should expect from those who have had little other stock in trade for a year than his sufferings.

At the Democratic State Convention of Ohio on Wednesday last, he was nominated for one of the four delegates from the State at large to the Chicago Convention. The vote stood Pendleton 231, Allen 233, Morgan 181, Thurman 241, Ranney 201, Vallandigham 196. On the second ballot the field was left clear for Vallandigham and Ranney, the latter being considered the representative of the war feeling of the party. Ranney beat the martyr five votes. A good deal of ill feeling grew out of it, and the martyr's friends threatened to leave the Convention. What is the use of being an exile and the victim of "executive usurpation" if it won't elect a man one of our delegates to so poor a thing as a Democratic Convention?—Ind. Jour.
