recognized acts Catman and The All-Nighters, Bullet Boys and Stephen Pearcy Stunt shows will entertain the C.R. owd in-between the band performances.

Several food, motorcycle and business vendors will be offering their fares (from 11 a.m. to 11 p.m.) and spots are still available for more to sign up as well.

Many motorcycle enthusiasts are expected to attend the event and citizens and spectators are invited and encouraged to line the roadways as the ride comes through in support of our nation's heroes.

A \$20 donation for the Wounded Warrior Project, per rider (or \$30 donation for a rider with passenger), will be collected at registration and each paid rider and passenger will receive a commemorative T-shirt (while supplies last).

In a press release, Elkhart Mayor Dick Moore encouraged residents and business leaders of "the City with a Heart" to support Elkhart's Freedom Ride and Bike Night.

"I promise you will have a great time, meet new friends, and enjoy all that downtown Elkhart has to offer," he said.

Statistics posted on The City of Elkhart's website noted interesting facts including that the average age of a "biker" is 40 plus years old, with a median annual income of more than \$50,000. Three-fifths of people referred to as "bikers" are married and more than half have attended college or technical school.

"Bikers are truly an asset to the City with a Heart and our community welcomes them with open arms," Mayor Moore was noted as saying.

Nappanee Police Chief Julie Dijkstra is also asking residents to make an effort to acknowledge the riders and their passengers for their generous efforts.

"Elkhart City Police have asked for our help in making this ride a success," she said. "They would love to have Market Street (U.S. 6) lined to welcome the riders to Nappanee. All Nappanee emergency services will be assisting as the riders, (maybe as many as 2,000) come through town."

Event exhibitors and vendors will be responsible for obtaining all applicable permits through the City of Elkhart and the Elkhart County Health Department and deposits for exhibitors and vendors must be paid by July 28 with the remaining half to be paid by Aug. 4.

however, that he discovered the folk music that would be his life. Armed with recordings of the great yodelers, Christensen returned from Europe, determined to master this ancient art — and he did. While driving the family tractor around and around the potato fields, he practiced 14-15 hours a day.

Christensen's first yodeling performance was in 1977, at a major university orientation assembly. Then his career really soared when Disney World in Orlando, Fla. hired him to work at the German Pavilion of the Epcot Center in 1984. He was the Disney World Yodeler from 1984 to 1990 and the leader of the night band for the last four of those years.

Christensen's performance, sponsored by the Wakarusa Bluegrass Festival Inc. will take place at the Goshen Theater July 26 at 7 p.m.

Man dies after not yielding right of way

WAKARUSA — A 71-year-old Mishawaka man died July 11 after he failed to yield the right of way at C.R. 7 and C.R. 40. At about 7:29 a.m. Joseph A. Richard was driving a 2006 Nissan south at C.R. 7 and stopped with his passenger at the two-way stop at C.R. 40.

Erin Rae Chupp, 19, of Goshen was at the same time driving a 1999 Nissan west on C.R. 40 when Richard pulled into his path. After being struck, Richard's vehicle slid off the southwest corner of the intersection and rolled onto its roof. Richard died at the scene of his injuries. His passenger, 72-year-old Thomas L. Klaer of Mishawaka was taken to Memorial Hospital in South Bend with broken ribs and Chupp was taken to Elkhart General Hospital with a laceration to his left leg. Richard was not wearing a seatbelt.
