APART FROM BEATEN TRACK

People of Small Island, Southwest of Java, Not Much Bothered With World Problems.

Christmas Island is located in mid-Pacific, close to the equator and due south of the Hawaiian archipelago. A cable station is there located. Very surprising, then, might seem a recent news dispatch which said that people living there had only just learned from a British warship that the war was at an end—their ignorance in this regard causing them to threaten with firearms a landing party of men whom they imagined to be Germans.

Explanation lies in the fact that the Christmas Island referred to in the dispatch is another island of the same name, 100 miles south of the western end of Java. It is a rather remarkable bit of terra firma, and was wholly uninhabited until 1887, when the first arriving settlers found it covered with dense forests. At the present time its population consists of about 250 Europeans, Malays, Sikhs and Chinese.

The island, twelve miles long by nine miles wide, is the flat summit of a submarine mountain, an extinct volcano over 15,000 feet high. Rising precipitously from the sea-door, the mountain emerges above water to a height of 1,000 feet, and all around it the ocean in its neighborhood is more than two and a half miles deep.

Anciently this tropical isle was of no great height above water, and ring-shaped, enclosing a lagoon—in other words, corresponding to the description of what we call an "atoll." The ring appears today as a flat central plateau with a raised edge. Much of the plateau is covered by a deposit of phosphate of lime many feet thick.

The mountain-top, before it was uplifted above the water, acquired a covering of shelly ooze that later became limestone rock. After its emergence it became a resort of multitudes of seabirds, whose droppings converted the carbonate of lime into phosphate of lime, most valuable for fertilizing purposes. It was the discovery of this precious resource that caused the British government to annex the island.

Diverse Feeling Concerning Dogs.


Everybody Was Glad.

Rice Terraces Are World's Masterpieces



This is a photograph of the Ifugao rice terraces, which are among the most remarkable of their kind in the world. They are one of the many marvels sights for the tourist to see in the Philippine Islands and are to be found in the Ifugao district of the Mountain province, Northern Luzon.

The height of these terraces, which are held up by stone walls, is from 4 to 18 feet, averaging 8 feet high. It is estimated there are 12,121 miles of eight-foot stone walls in the Ifugao terraces, which is approximately half the distance around the world.

These terraces are artificially irrigated by water brought in troughs along the precipitous mountain slopes over long distances.
