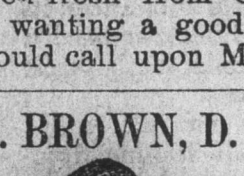

Since that time he has successfully filled the Episcopal See of this diocese.

APPLICATION FOR LICENSE.

Notice is hereby given to the citizens of the town of Fair Oaks and Union township, in Jasper county, Indiana, that the undersigned, Charles A. Gundy, who is a male inhabitant of the state of Indiana, and who is over the age of twenty-one years, and who is a man of good moral character, and who is not in the habit of becoming intoxicated, and is in every respect a fit and proper person to be entrusted with a license authorizing him to sell intoxicating liquors, will make application at the March session of the Board of Commissioners of the county of Jasper, and state of Indiana, said session commencing on the 6th day of March, A. D. 1894, and to be held in the court house, in Rensselaer, to sell and barter spirituous, vinous, malt and all other intoxicating liquors in less quantity than a quart at a time, with the privilege of allowing and permitting the same to be drunk on the premises where sold and bartered. The precise location of the premises in which said liquors are to be sold and bartered is as follows, to-wit: The front room in the lower story of a two-story frame building situated on lot six (6), block one (1), in the town of Fair Oaks, Jasper county, Indiana, more particularly described as follows, to-wit: Commencing at the northeasterly corner of lot six (6), thence in a westerly direction parallel with Second street twenty (20) feet; thence in a southerly direction parallel with Hendricks street eighteen (18) feet; thence in an easterly direction parallel with First street twenty (20) feet; thence in a northerly direction parallel with Kent street eighteen (18) feet to the point of commencement.

Said license will be asked for the period of one year.
