A Lecture on the Fur Seal.

A lecture on the fur seal will be given by Dr. B. W. Everman of the U. S. Fish Commission at the opera house, Feb. 19. Prof. Everman comes here under the auspices of the Rensselaer High School. He was sent by the U. S. Government during the summer of 1892 to the North Pacific for the purpose of making a scientific investigation of the fur seal and its habits, and to collect information for the Board of Arbitration in settling the dispute which arose between the U. S. and Great Britain over their respective rights to take seals in those waters. Prof. Everman is a "Hoosier" having been born and reared in Carroll county.
