The continued wet weather for the last few weeks has done untold damage to the corn crop in this locality.

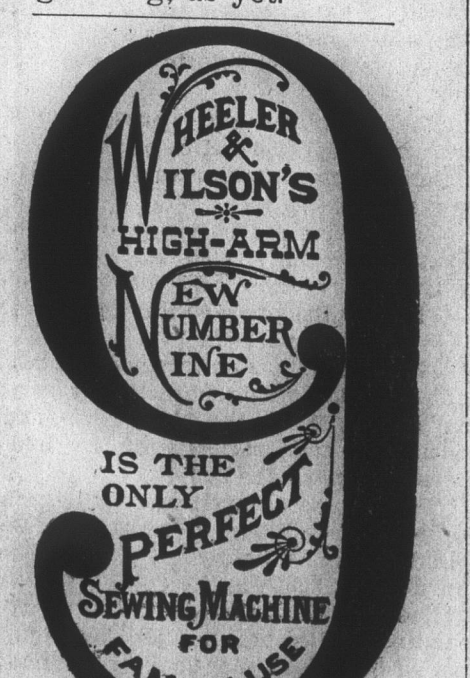
Brewster Pedit went to Rensselaer last Tuesday on legal business.
