In addition to the pay above stated, one ration per day and an abundant supply of good clothing is allowed to every soldier. Quarters, fuel and medical attendance are also provided by the Government without deduction from the soldier's pay. If a soldier should become disabled in the line of his duties, the law provides for him a pension, or he may, if he prefer it, obtain admission into the Military Asylum, which will afford him a comfortable home so long as he may wish to receive its benefits.		
To the above pay for private soldiers must be added the additional \$2 a month to be paid during service, the \$100 bounty at the end of the war, which has already been provided for, and the quarter-section of land that Congress will provide for at its coming session. The bounty and land apply to officers and privates alike.
