We are informed that the Post office of Fairmount in this County has been discontinued. Letters addressed to that office will therefore fail to reach their destination.

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## ANOTHER RAIL ROAD.

We learn that it is in contemplation to construct a new line of rail road in Northern Indiana, running southwardly from Goshen in Elkhart County, through Marshall, Starke, Jasper, and Newton Counties in this State, and Iroquois County in Illinois, to Gilman Station at the junction of the Illinois Central and the Logansport, Peoria and Burlington rail roads. The proposed name for the road is "Great Southwestern." We understand that Grovertown, and Knox in Starke County, are to be points on the line of this road. If so, it would pass a few miles West of Plymouth. Now if we are to have another rail road through this County we are decidedly in favor of making Plymouth a point, and believe that it will be the interest of the new Company as well as of the citizens of the county generally to do so. The people of Starke county are alive to their interests in this matter, and have already been holding meetings and taking active steps to secure the early commencement of the work.
