In the death of Nelson Dingley, James G. Blaine's great successor as a protectionist, the nation loses a statesman to whom is due a debt of gratitude for framing the specific measure that rescued industrial America from threatened dissolution and placed it on its financial feet once more.

Congress takes up the Nicaraguan canal question this week. If congress is really in touch with the people, the matter will be pushed to as speedy a decision as is consistent with business principles, and the decision will be favorable to the construction of that immense and highly necessary waterway.

If Senator Hoar's resolution to declare the Philippines "free and independent" should by any chance—which it will not—be adopted, the people of those islands would soon relapse into savage anarchy and their country, with its immense and valuable resources, would be at the mercy of any semi-mercenary foreign power that would be first to take advantage of the situation. Expansion or no expansion, call it what you will, this country has a practical condition to face practically and cannot afford to prove itself a collection of unmitigated chumps.

The Indianapolis Journal of yesterday contained the following naval information: The secretary of the navy has published a statement of the purchases of auxiliary naval vessels made by the department out of the appropriation of \$50,000,000 for national defense at the beginning of the war. This statement shows that 102 vessels were purchased at a total cost to the government of \$17,956,850. This included thirty-eight steamships, costing \$10,195,898; twenty-six yachts, \$2,622,500; twenty-nine tugs, \$1,635,863; four cruisers, \$3,379,542; three lighters and barges, \$45,800; and two torpedo boats, \$97,247. Thirty-five of the vessels were built in foreign ship yards, namely, twenty-five steamships, five yachts, three cruisers and two torpedo boats. The only regrettable feature in the case is that it was necessary to purchase any foreign-built vessels. It is to be hoped that long before we have another war American ship building and the American marine will have so progressed that we will be in a position to sell ships instead of having to buy them.
