EXCITING GAME.

OPENING POLO GAME OF THE SEASON

Proves One of the Most Exciting Ever Witnessed in This City—The Score Was 2 to 2—Hairagains Prove a Tough Proposition for the Henleys.

The "Hairagains" and the Henleys played an exciting game of polo last night at the ring and opened the season in an auspicious manner, by playing one of the best games ever seen in this city. The score at the close of the third inning was 2 to 2, and should have been played out to decide the winner, but Mr. Henley refused to do so on account of the injury to one of his players. The "Hairagains," managed by Martin, put up a surprisingly warm game and made the claim that if the time in the third inning had not been extended the game would not have resulted in a tie, but the score would have been 2 to 1 in the Hairagains' favor. On the other hand Mr. Henley claims the exact time limit was observed and that the time was taken out when the players were stopped for any cause. Both sides played a remarkably fast game and both seemed determined to win at all hazards. The Henley players were the more tricky of the two teams.

Young Mansfield probably put up the most brilliant game of the evening, and for a man who has played very little, he gives promise of becoming one of the best in the city. Stevens and Byer for the Henleys played in their usual fine form, while Williams and Byers did excellent work for the Hairagains. Byers was hurt slightly several times during the game, but each time pluckily went back into the game.

The attendance was the largest of the season thus far and both the old and new balconies were well filled. Another game will be arranged for in the near future and the tie will be played off.

NARROW ESCAPES.

A Record of Two of Them—A Painter At the Court House This Morning. Robert McNamara's Close Call.

This morning at the court house James Logan had a narrow escape from instant and violent death. He was working on a scaffold at the third story windows on the north end of the court house, when the end of the scaffolding gave way. He was some forty feet from the ground when the scaffold slipped and he would have been killed instantly and mangled at that had he not pluckily hung to a rope and let himself down by means of the rope. The red paint was spilled all over the end of the court house and on the gray stone it looks very much as if a half dozen men had been stabbed just above the bloody street that runs down the side of the building.

Some days ago Robert McNamara of this city had a narrow escape from a horrible death at Indianapolis. He was employed as fireman in the railroad yards, and was under a locomotive cleaning out an ash pan when the engine, not knowing Robert was under there, started the engine. McNamara had the presence of mind in his great fright to seize the axle of the engine and yell like a Calumet Tartar. The engineer heard his cries and stopped the machine and Robert crawled out unhurt. He quit his job and came home to Richmond.
