RAILROAD NOTES.

The Pennsylvania management has appropriated \$100,000 for the purpose of installing and operating the locomotive testing plant at the St. Louis exposition. The result of the tests will be arranged by the committee and will be published in book form, thereby insuring a volume of great scientific and engineering value.

It is announced that \$20,000,000 will be spent in improvements on the Pennsylvania lines west of Pittsburg the present year. This money was raised when the Pennsylvania company borrowed \$50,000,000 on notes a few weeks ago. During the season much work will be done in the extension of double tracks on the Panhandle between Columbus and Indianapolis, and Columbus and Chicago. A large mileage of the Pittsburg, Fort Wayne & Chicago is already double-tracked, and most of the improvements to be made this year will be on the Panhandle.


