"Thrillers" is the only word that aptly describes the sensational features of the big Barnum & Bailey circus this year. There is an unusually large number of these "thrillers," and they will be seen here next Friday, July 8, for the first time, but three of them stand out with such prominence as to call for special mention. In the language of the circus bill, "Volo, the Volitant" cycles the aerial arch. Solo descends a ladder on a single wheel while carrying a companion on his shoulder, and Ancillotti turns a somersault on a bicycle while "looping the gap." This, however, gives no adequate idea of the character of the acts nor the sensations they produce when seen for the first time.

Perhaps the most interesting of these three acts is the whirlwind descent and night of the daring Volo. Starting from a platform elevated fifty feet in the air, Volo wheels down a run-way ninety-three feet in length, secures sufficient momentum to fly fifty feet through space, lands on a second incline and descends to the ground with the speed of an express train. The act displays great cleverness as well as remarkable nerve. The incline is less than three feet in width and the slightest swerving of the wheel would cause the rider to dart over the edge and be dashed to the ground. The cleverness of the rider is also shown in bringing the wheel down to the second incline. Should the bicycle strike on the back wheel the rider would be thrown an involuntary somersault and probably injure his back or kill himself. Volo overcomes this by perfect mastery of the wheel. There is a certain point in the flight when the momentum of the wheel seems to overcome the resistance of the air. At this moment Volo dexterously throws his front wheel down and the bicycle drops to the platform, striking fairly on both wheels. This enables the rider to descend safely and with great momentum. A thing that gives the Volo act an added interest is the fact that the daring rider is never lost to view. From the time he leaves the elevated platform until he stops his wheel at the far end of the hippodrome track, he is always in sight, and every action can be watched and studied from all parts of the great tent.



Volo's real name is Charles B. Clarke. He is a man of rather small stature, and with his close trimmed beard, is the perfect type of a young physician. In fact, he is "Doc" Clarke to all the circus.

"I was doing the 'loop the loop' act last season," he said recently. "This new act was suggested by a combination of the ideas of 'loop the loop' and 'shooting the chutes.' It was all figured out mathematically, to ascertain the angle necessary for each platform and the space that could be jumped. Then we had civil engineers figuring on it. Finally models were made, with marbles instead of a bicycle. When I made the first jump everything was surrounded by nets. Everything worked just as anticipated, and I came out all right. When I tried it again I fell. I was not hurt very much and was soon on to the knack of it. There is a moment just as it looks when I practically stand still in the air. That is when the force of gravity overcomes the upward tendency, and I begin to come down. The tendency all of the time that I am in the air is to fall on my back, and I have to throw my weight forward. It is, of course, more difficult to control a bicycle in the air than on the ground."

The trick riding down a ladder on a unicycle is a most difficult as well as dangerous one, and its perilous character is enhanced by the fact that the rider carries another member of the circus company on his shoulders. It is difficult to ride a single wheel on a level space, but to fly down an incline on a unicycle is a feat that few would dare to attempt. Solo, however, does it at every performance and wins a generous amount of applause for his cleverness and daring.

Scientifically, however, the most daring, as well as the most dangerous, of these "thrillers" is the "gap." Those who have seen the "loop the loop" apparatus will readily understand the arrangement of the paraphernalia used in this feat. It is, in effect, a great loop with a section of top removed. The opening thus made is close to twenty feet. Like Volo, Ancillotti, who "loops the gap," starts from an elevated platform and gets his momentum on an inclined runway. This momentum must be

sufficient to carry him over the "gap"—no more—no less. Too much would throw him over the top of the second part of the loop. Insufficient momentum would make him fall in the open space. The whole thing, therefore, had to be worked out with the greatest mathematical precision.

Another danger is that the rider may fall back on the runway. This is partially avoided by a slight curve in the initial part of the circle. This, however, necessitates remarkable skill on the part of the rider for he must guide his wheel up the oblique path and literally throw himself into a position where his wheel will strike fairly on the opposite side. This must be accomplished, too, while the rider and wheel are turning a complete somersault. He succeeds in doing it, however, and difficult and dangerous as the act is, an accident seldom occurs.

Ancillotti, who performs this great feat is an Italian. He was born in Turin, Italy about 34 years ago. His father was a famous performer on the wheel, and was, in fact, the first European artist to give a public exhibition on a bicycle. That was forty years ago. Young Ancillotti began his career as a performer at the age of four years. He was a member of his father's troupe, and performed a series of tricks on a tiny wheel. A few years ago his father retired, and since that time Ancillotti has been an inventor and performer of sensational acts. He introduced the "loop the loop" in Europe, invented the double loop, in which two daring bicycle riders ride around the circle simultaneously, and was the first man to cycle the "aerial arch" in France. The "gap" which he exploits at the Barnum & Bailey circus, is his own invention, and is patented in this country and in most of the European countries.

H. Stuart, of Minneapolis. Mr. Stuart was born on June 30.

Mr. Stuart is in good health, in full possession of his faculties, deeply interested in current events and a daily reader of the newspaper.

His eldest daughter, Mrs. William Bundy, of Dunreith, who is past 70, was able to be present, coming by interurban from her door to his own. Father Stuart is in position to fully appreciate all these modern miracles of convenience as the present generation never can.

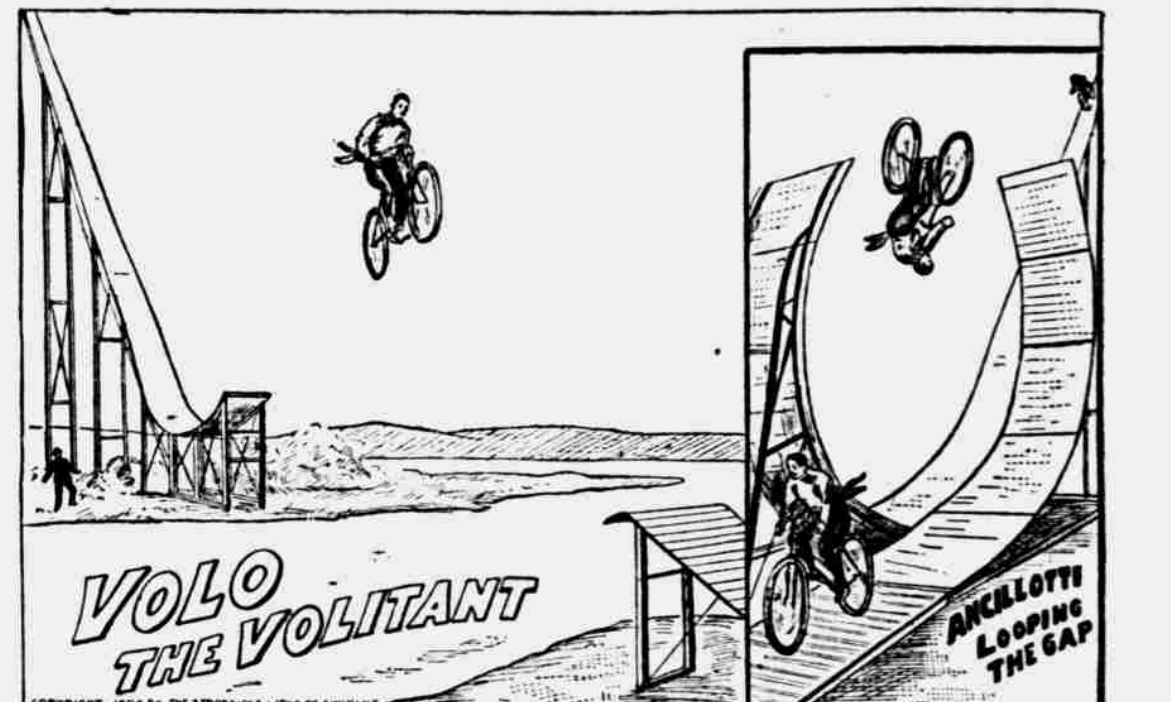
