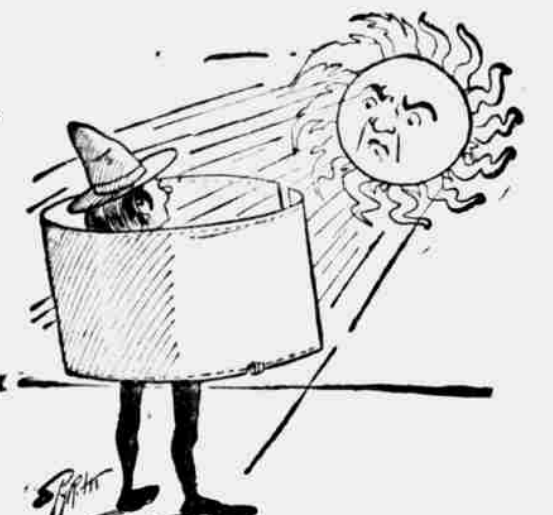

St. Louis, Mo., July 3.—Much has been said in Richmond in regard to inconveniences and extravagant prices at the St. Louis fair. Such is false in the extreme. As far as expenses are concerned the cost of a sojourn of ten days here may be made very reasonable. Thousands of private houses in the city have been opened for the entertainment of fair visitors for a reasonable price varying from fifty cents to two dollars per day, which usually includes breakfast. The following tabulated statement will show the cost of a day at the fair:

Lodging and breakfast\$1.25
Car fare to grounds05
Admission to grounds50
Dinner on grounds35
Car fare down town05
Supper25
Total\$2.45

One wishing to remain a week, which is a usual thing, at this rate would have an expense of \$17.15 not including car fare.

SCANDINAVIAN EMIGRANTS

TO THE NUMBER OF ABOUT SEVEN HUNDRED

PERISH IN THE SEA

Most of the Boats Smashed by Towering Waves—Details.

London, July 4.—More than 700 Scandinavian emigrants perished in the North sea in the wreck of the American line Norge, according to reports brought by twenty-seven survivors brought into Grimsby harbor, fifteen miles from Hull, by British travelers tonight.

Only two boats are said to have escaped from the wreck. The occupants say that the Norge, bound from Copenhagen for New York, struck a rock in a dense fog and a heavy sea and went down in a few minutes.

Most of the boats were smashed by the towering waves while the crew was attempting to lower them. Further details of the tragedy are lacking as yet.

The Norge which has been in the Copenhagen-New York service of the Scandinavian-American line for a number of years, was an iron vessel of 3,318 tons gross and 2,121 tons net. Her principal dimensions were: Length 340 feet, breadth 40 feet and depth 25 feet.
