## WILLIAM D. REID HAS BIRTHDAY

A PIONEER OF WAYNE COUNTY CELEBRATES HIS

81ST ANNIVERSARY

Read the Palladium in 1843 and Has Been a Subscriber Ever Since.

One of the oldest pioneers of Wayne county celebrated today his eighty-first birthday. William D. Reid was born July sixth, 1823, and has reached the milestone on which are the figures "81" in his long and useful life, one that has caused him to be known over a great part of the country and to be classed among Indiana's oldest men. He was born in the times when this state was but barely beginning to be settled, after seven years of troublesome growth, and he was known among the politicians and public men of the middle part of the nineteenth century. Mr. Reid called at the Palladium office yesterday. He is in a fine state of health.

He first read the Palladium in 1843 and has been a subscriber ever since, through its columns keeping closely in touch with public affairs. He voted for Henry Clay in 1844, his first vote after entering into manhood, and he expects after sixty years of voting to cast a ballot for Theodore Roosevelt, Republican nominee for President, this year. The Palladium most heartily hopes that he may do so and to continue his usefulness for many years.
