ALL READY FOR CANNON MEETING

GATHERING WILL BE A VERY
LARGE ONE

GREAT ENTHUSIASM

Will Prevail and the Opening of the
Local Campaign Will Be
Auspicious.

This evening when the doors of the Coliseum are thrown open for the beginning of the campaign in Wayne County, and when Joseph G. Cannon will deliver an address, it is probable that the meeting will be one of the largest, most enthusiastic gatherings of ardent Republicans ever held in this city.

"Uncle Joe" will be a good one to open the campaign, and the choice of him was a wise one. Mr. Cannon is one of the hardest working Republicans in the country and the Republicans of the county will have a great impetus added to their ardor by his address.

The gathering will, in all probability, be the largest political affair of the kind held in this state, outside of Indianapolis, in many years. The supposed closeness of the campaign in this state which will be a "battle-ground" where the war will be waged will draw over four thousand people to Richmond, to the Coliseum tonight. The crowd, will at all events, be the largest ever seen in this county.

To aid in rousing the enthusiasm, the drum and bugle corps, which have recently been formed to give good service for the local G. O. P. during the present campaign, will be on hand with its martial and inspiring airs. The drum corps always adds a great deal to a campaign, and is a strong factor, as much so as the old "torch light parades" of days gone by. The Young Men's Republican Club, another recent organization of enthusiastic Republicans, will be on hand, and from present indications the enthusiasm will be unbounded. Everything has been completed in the way of preliminary arrangements, and the outlook has not a cloud.
