The Labrador coast was swept by a heavy gale last week and eleven vessels, mostly fish boats were driven ashore, the greater portion of them being totally wrecked. Seven sailors belonging to two craft were drowned.

"White House, Washington, Sept. 26,
"Your telegram received. The letter you refer to purporting to be addressed by me to Michael Donnelly and printed in the Miners' Magazine of Sept. 22 is, of course, an absurd and impudent forgery. I have written no such letter nor any letter even resembling it to Mr. Donnelly nor anyone else. I have written Mr. Donnelly requesting to know if he has received any such letter and requesting him if so to at once lay it before the district attorney of Chicago to find out whether it is possible to discover and punish the forgers.
