NEW BUILDING

Addition to the Hoosier Drill—Large Order to Buenos Ayres.

The Hoosier Drill Branch of the American Seeding Machine Company will probably build an addition to its present large factory in the near future. Representatives from the general office at Springfield were in the city yesterday looking over the ground and making measurements. Their opinion will be placed before the board of directors of the company which will decide whether the building is to be built or not. The new building will be four stories and will be built on the ground north of the present factory near the railroad. The local factory will increase its working force next week and start to work on an order of 32 cars of goods for Buenos Ayres.
