HARD WORK BEING DONE

To Get the Division in the Best Possible Condition.

The general managers' annual inspection of the Pennsylvania lines west of Pittsburgh will be commenced at Columbus on the 18th inst., and will be conducted for about four days. Heretofore the inspection party has always started from Pittsburgh.

The inspection party will travel in three special trains and will go from Columbus to Chicago via Dayton, Richmond, New Castle and Logansport, and will return east over the Ft. Wayne road.

The inspection party will be composed of the general manager, general superintendent, all the division superintendents, engineers maintenance of way and assistant engineers.

The usual prizes of \$100 for the supervisors' best division, \$50 for the second best division and \$50 for the best section of each supervisor's division will be awarded.

For two consecutive Sundays Pennsylvania section men on the Richmond division have been required to don their working clothes and go out along the track and toil the same as any other day. The reason assigned for this is that the section men are working overtime to get things in shape for the inspection.

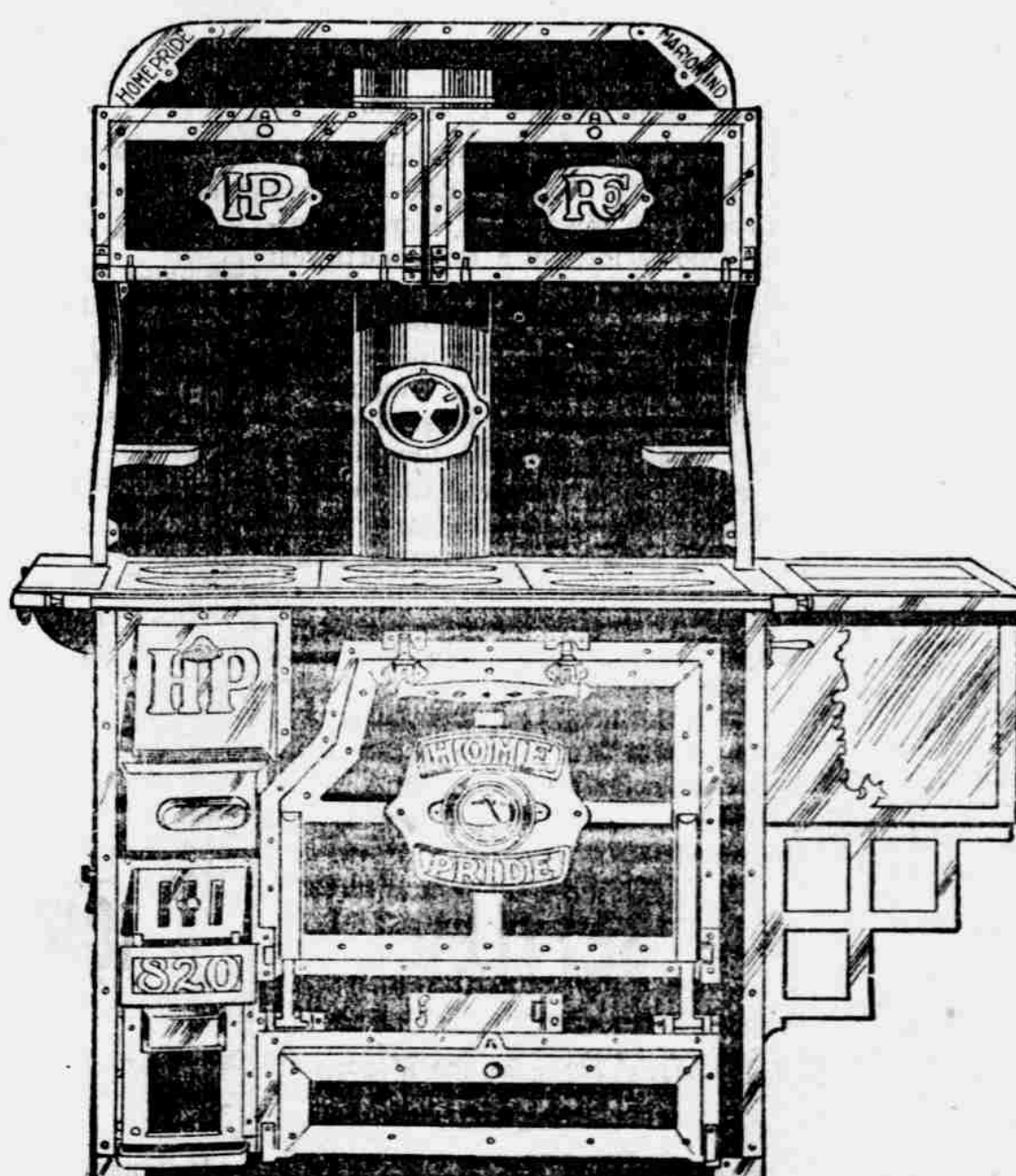
