### IGNORANCE OR MENDACITY—WHICH?

From letter of William E. Curtis in the Chicago Record-Herald:

"The statements Judge Parker utters (in his speech on the Philippines) are so false and absurd and ridiculous that he deserves more pity than blame. For example, he tells us that 'We have wasted over \$660,000,000 of the people's money and sacrificed over 200,000 lives' in the Philippines. \* \* At the outside figures the total expenditures of the United States government since Admiral Dewey entered the bay of Manila with his fleet have been under \$225,000,000, including the \$20,000,000 paid to Spain.

"His assertion that 200,000 lives have been sacrificed is even more absurd and sensational, and it would not be true if every man—soldier, sailor or civilian—who has gone to the Philippine Archipelago for any reason since May 1, 1898, had died and was buried there. The total number of deaths from all causes in the army in the Philippine Islands during the six years of American occupation is 155 officers and 4,700 men.

"Here you will perceive that Judge Parker has either been betrayed or is guilty of gross prevarication. Whichever way you look at it, everybody will agree that such absurd and reckless statements do not commend the man for president of the United States."
