MUST BECOME CONVERT BEFORE BECOMING WIFE

Princess Edna Studying Catholic Religion Preparatory to Wedding Alfonso.

Rome, Jan. 5.—Reports in circulation to the effect that negotiations are proceeding at the Vatican regarding the forthcoming marriage of the King of Spain to Princess Edna of Battenberg, are without foundation. The Vatican has not yet been officially notified that such a marriage is to take place. It is supposed here that the Princess is being instructed with a view to her conversion to Catholicism by Father Bernard Vaughan, of the Jesuit Order, a brother of the late Cardinal Archbishop of Westminster.

It is expected that the Princess will come to Rome after her conversion and before her marriage, on a visit to the Pope, as she will be unable to do so when she becomes Queen of Spain, because of the relation between the Quirinal and the Vatican.
