AIR SHIP TOO DELICATE

FOR REACHING NORTH POLE

Explorer Peary Tells of the Possibility of Invading Land of Ice Through The Air—Undecided About Another Trip.

(Publishers' Press.)
Halifax, Nov. 26.—Robert E. Peary, the Arctic explorer, and Mrs. Peary left Sydney by rail for New York. Regarding another trip to the north pole, Peary says he will not be able to make any announcement until after he meets his friends in New York and discusses the matter with them.

The male and female of Peary's steamer, who are Newfoundlanders, were paid off, the vessel will be put on the marine railway at North Sydney to be overhauled and a new crew will be engaged.

Peary said he usually employs Newfoundlanders for far north work, not because they are better than Americans, but because their sailing experience accustoms them to dealing with pack ice. He adheres to his conviction that sledging is the best known method of reaching the north pole, but he would advocate aerial navigation if it were possible to obtain a good airship. He considers the present flying machines too imperfect and delicate for Arctic work.

Bride Bound and Robbed.

Columbus, O., Nov. 26.—In a collision between a carriage and Westernville street car, near Linden, Miss Josie Hewitt, 40, of Darbyville, an evangelist and W. C. T. U. worker, was instantly killed. She either jumped or was thrown from the carriage, falling on the tracks, and her body was dragged 15 feet and badly mangled. Death was instantaneous. Others in the carriage were injured.
