TOWN BOARD UPHOLD BY THE COMMISSION

The New State Railroad Body Gives Out Ruling.

PROTECT GRADE CROSSINGS

The first appeal to the Railroad commission under the amendment to the municipal corporation act allowing an appeal to the commission from the orders of town boards establishing gates and bells and watchmen at the street crossings of railroads was decided by the commission Friday.

The trustees of the town of Ft. Branch, Gibson county, passed a resolution ordering the E. & T. H. Railroad company to put gates at two street crossings and electric bells at three other crossings. The railroad company appealed from the town board to the railroad commission. The matter went to Judge W. J. Wood of the commission, who held an investigation at Ft. Branch, and reported an order confirming the action of the town board, provided the railroad company should not submit practical plans for protecting these crossings satisfactory to the board of trustees of Ft. Branch, and the Railroad commission within thirty days.

Colliers employed in certain pits in the Manchester district are now working half a mile below ground. There are colliers in Ashton, Bradford (Manchester) and Pendleton which are more than a half mile in depth, and others are about to be sunk in other parts of southern Lancashire which will be nine hundred yards down. The men working at these great depths have to take huge quantities of liquid with them owing to the great heat which prevails, many of them taking two quarts of cold tea in big tin cans. The Pendleton pit of Messrs. A. Knowles is more than 1,100 yards in depth.—Westminster Gazette.
