SUITS FOR APPEAL FROM ASSESSMENTS

Southwest D Street Subject of Litigation.

DAMAGES NOT ENOUGH.

Three suits for appeal from the assessments of damages by the city in the matter of straightening Southwest D street were filed in the circuit court. The suits are as follows: Levi M. Jones and Ella J. Jones against the City of Richmond, Arlington M. Van Baalen against the City of Richmond, Joseph Werner against the City of Richmond.

Levi M. Jones and Ella J. Jones were awarded \$165 benefits and \$50 damages. They ask for \$200 damages. Arlington Van Baalen was awarded \$200 benefits and \$50 damages; \$200 damages are asked for. Joseph Werner was awarded \$125 benefits and \$50 damages. He also appeals for \$200 damages. Robbins, Starr & Robbins appear in all three cases.

NO SERIOUS TROUBLE AT LIGHT PLANT

President Merrill Denies Some Late Reports.

WITHERBY WAS A VISITOR.

C. E. Mead of Dayton, consulting engineer, who prepared the plans and specifications for the improvements recently compelled at the Municipal light plant, is in the city for the purpose of inspecting the work done at the plant.

President Merrill states that the reports which have been published that there has been serious trouble with one of the old engines, are "hot air," pure and simple. There was a serious breakdown about six weeks ago and since that time there have been minor difficulties, but of late there has never been any trouble which threatened to seriously incapacitate the plant.

Mr. Merrill states that last Friday E. E. Witherby, vice president of the New York Gas and Electric company, which controls the Richmond Light, Heat and Power company, was a visitor at the Municipal plant. Mr. Merrill hints that the reports may have been inspired by Mr. Witherby, who is a sworn enemy of the city plant.
