I like you awfully well and I like the others too, but—" and here the little girl sorrow overcame her fortitude, and she burst out sobbing. Gently the teacher then drew from her the facts. The mother had been left destitute by an unkind father and the family was without means of support. Five little mouths were to be fed, ten little feet needed shoes, ten little hands needed mittens, but nothing was left in the larder and furthermore there was no money. Such was the story. Subsequent investigation showed that the little girl did not have on a single piece of underwear and that her shoes had paper in the bottom to protect her feet against the snow. Needless to say, Mary, the favorite of the school, was soon provided for through the efforts of a loving teacher, and the associated charities is now looking after the needs of the other members of the family.

As money is never given by the associated charities, and only provisions, clothing and fuel, are supplied to the needy, there is a great demand by the management of the association for such supplies. It is stated that there has been a less amount of donations made by citizens to the association than during previous years. The association is particularly desirous of securing underwear, shoes and other kinds of clothing. Every day children come to Mrs. Candler asking for clothing and she is compelled to turn them away because of a lack of these essential articles. Mrs. Candler stated that there is not a well-to-do family in Richmond that does not have outgrown underwear and clothing laid away, that could be given to

the association where it could be distributed to gladden the hearts of dozens in need.

NEW SCHEDULE OF INSURANCE RATES

Dean System Will Become Operative in Richmond
About January 1.

ALL NOT SATISFIED WITH IT

RATE WAR ABOUT ONLY STYLE OF OPPOSITION THAT CAN BE USED—THIS IS NOT TO AGENTS' INTERESTS.

Although one or two of the insurance companies are not satisfied with the Dean analytic schedule, which is soon to be put into effect in Richmond, local insurance authorities say there will be no contest made. The schedule probably will go into effect here

January 1. Just how extensive the changes in rating will be is not known. An Indianapolis dispatch says: It is the general belief among fire insurance men of Indianapolis that the Dean analytic schedule will be applied in all cities of Indiana without further trouble. The present condition of finances is one reason for coming to this conclusion. Both fire insurance companies and fire insurance agents at present are anxious to collect as much in premiums as possible. Rate wars are about the only style of opposition possible in fighting the Dean schedule, and rate wars mean a falling off in the premium collections. It is believed that agents all over the State will collect the premiums without opposition rather than submit to a rate war.
