league, but there is some doubt if he
can interest any financial backing
there, owing to the fact that Hamilton
is represented in the K. I. O. league.
All the leading sporting men in Ham-
ilton are interested in this team. The
K. I. O. league plays only Sunday ball.Every effort will be made to place a
team in Muncie, which would make an
excellent baseball town provided a
park near the center of the city could
be secured. Marion will in all proba-
bility be included in the I. O. league
as the traction interests in that city
desire to have Marion represented by
a team in a good league next season.
Lima, O., and Piqua, O., are also de-
sired by the promoters of the league.Manager Jessup is already beginning
to receive applications from players
who are anxious to catch on with the
local club next season. Manager Jess-
up states that he has as yet signed no
players for next season. He will not
attempt to secure players until the or-
ganization of the I. O. league has been
completed. Many new faces will be
seen on the Richmond team when it is
organized.Baseball fans are preparing to turn
out en masse, for the dance to be given
Wednesday evening, December 18, at
the Coliseum. This dance is to be
given by the Richmond Amusement
company to secure money to complete
improvements at Athletic park. Wo-
men will be admitted without charge.
