BRILLIANT FETES MARRED BY ILLNESS OF ADMIRAL EVANS

The Admiral Has an Attack of Rheumatism and Will Be Unable to Attend Many Social Engagements.

PAPERS NOW PUBLISHED IN ENGLISH FOR SAILORS.

Commenting Upon Strained Relations of Delegates to The Hague, But Say There Is No Danger of Break.

Rio Janeiro, Jan. 14.—Swinging lazily at their anchors, the American battle ships seem as though they are enjoying a well-earned rest after their run of 3,000 miles and more from Trinidad. They lay under the green hills of Rio, in the shadow of Mr. Corcovada, that looks right down into the streets of the city, and soon today the streets took on a lively appearance, as thousands made their way down by the edge of the water where they could watch the ships and the launches dashing in and out.

A right warm welcome awaited the fleet from the very moment the signal flags went up announcing its appearance, and from the first landing of the "Liberty" men until anchor is weighed again Rio has much in store for those who wish to view its beautiful points and enjoy its bounty.

Entertainments have been arranged for almost every hour of the day, and some of the hours of the night as well, but the fact that Rear Admiral Evans, the commander of the fleet is ill, is cause for the deepest regret. The Brazilian officials deplore this the more, as they wished especially to make this visit the occasion for marked attentions to the Americans, but Admiral Evans is suffering with rheumatism, and it is feared he will not be able to be present at the fetes, and without his presence these must lose something of their character.

Yesterday Admirals Emory, Thomas and Sperry, accompanied by the captains of all the battleships, paid a visit to the minister of marine, Admiral Alencar, who returned the visit on board Admiral Evans's flagship, the Connecticut. Later the American officers went to Petropolis, the home of the diplomatic corps, some 22 miles distant from the capital, to attend the reception of President Penna and a banquet given in their honor by the American Ambassador, Irving B. Dudley.

All the papers here published long accounts of the voyage of the American fleet and the manner of its welcome here. The Journal of Commerce which is printing an edition in English, publishes dispatches from New York to the effect that the people of the United States are curiously anxious as to the nature of the reception the fleet will meet at Rio Janeiro in view of the differences between the respective delegations of the two countries at the recent Peace Conference at The Hague. "The American people may set their minds at rest," says the paper, "for never was a heartier or more spontaneous welcome extended to the representatives of any nation than that which yesterday Brazilians extended to the brothers of the North."

Notice to Candidates

The Wayne County Republican Central Committee, in regular session, Monday, January 13, 1908, adopted the following rule to govern the primary election, February 10, 1908:

"The use of money or other things of value, directly or indirectly, in any manner, for the purpose of influencing or with the intent to influence, voters in this primary election, and all 'treating' by candidates is prohibited.

"Any candidate who shall, directly or indirectly, either by himself or through others, hire or employ any person to work for him at the polls on election day, or who shall, directly or indirectly, by the use of money or other things of value, or by the promise of any reward, money or thing of value, whatsoever, attempt to influence or induce anyone to vote for him, or who shall, during his canvass, resort to the common practice of 'treating' voters, is hereby declared ineligible as a nominee for any office at such primary.

"And, any candidate who shall use any such method or means as above set forth shall thereby forfeit his right to become a nominee for any office at such primary, even though he shall receive a plurality or majority of the votes cast; and in such event the candidate receiving the next highest number of votes and who has not violated any provision of this rule, shall be and become the nominee for such office.

"This committee shall determine all questions arising under this rule, or the violation thereof, and the decision or finding of this committee shall be conclusive.

"Each candidate to be voted for in this primary, in consideration of having his name printed upon the ballot, must give his assent to this rule, in writing, and agree to be bound by its provisions."

The committee hereby serves notice on all concerned that this rule is now effective. The co-operation of all candidates is solicited in support of the rule.

CAT'S INTERNAL ORGANS IN MAN

New Surgery May Make It Possible, Says a New York Professor.

KIDNEYS CAN BE CHANGED.

New York, Jan. 14.—Prof. Simeon Flexner, president of the Rockefeller Institute for Medical Research, says:

"Substitution of the healthy organs of the lower animals for the diseased parts of the human body will be made possible through the new experimental surgery and vivisection and will revolutionize modern medicine. The successful transplanting by Dr. Alexis Carrel of arteries and kidneys from one animal to another is the first step toward this end."

New Heart Coming Next.

It is predicted by Prof. Flexner that the new surgery will before long give a new heart, stomach, or kidneys to a man in place of the ones he fears may fall him at any moment. The promised new cure for Bright's disease, for instance, is the removal of the diseased kidney or kidneys and the substitution of the healthy kidneys of a living cat. The cat will surely die, but the man may live.

This assurance is given in the face of the fact that every one of fourteen cats to which Dr. Carrel transferred the kidneys from other cats, died in from one to forty-six days after the operation.

OPPOSE DEDICATION ON MEMORIAL DAY

Veterans Will Not Attend Harrison Ceremonies If on That Day.

PRESIDENT NO INDUCEMENT

One thing has been practically settled in connection with the plans for the Benjamin Harrison monument dedication in Indianapolis, namely, that if the dedication is conducted on May 30, Memorial day, it will not be attended by representatives of the Indiana G. A. R., not even if President Roosevelt himself delivers the dedicatory address. It has been indicated in dispatches from Washington that May 30 would be a good time to conduct the dedication because the session of congress would not interfere at that time. It is expected that congress will have adjourned by that time and that President Roosevelt may be able to come to Indianapolis then.

Reports from a number of G. A. R. posts of the state have been received at the Indiana G. A. R. headquarters and, without exception, these reports indicate that the soldiers will observe Memorial day on May 30, and will not attend the Harrison monument exercises. All who have reported say that it is the desire of their posts to attend the Harrison ceremonies, but they will not do so at the expense of the Memorial day observance.

RUSSIANS LIARS SAYS PROFESSOR

Money Sent to Red Cross Goes to Dukes.

Ithaca, N. Y., Jan. 14.—Money sent from America to the Russian Red Cross society goes into the pockets of grand dukes and bureaucrats, according to a statement made by Prof. Ralph Catrall of Cornell. He spent last summer in Russia. Prof. Catrall declares the Russians are great liars and he asserts autocracy rules. An even chance for liberty, he says, is far away and civilization is further off.

BLUE LAWS REIGN IN HARTFORD CITY

Police Department Resents Charge That It Has Not Done Duty.

SUNDAY LID TO BE CLAMPED

Hartford City, Ind., Jan. 14.—For the first time in years there will be a strict observance of the Sabbath in this city next Sunday. Mayor James Lucas today issued an edict to this effect and at the same time gave explicit instructions to the police under his command that all the laws regarding Sunday closing must be observed to the letter.

Cigar stores, bakeries, candy kitchens and all other shops must close and stay closed during the day. Only drug stores will be allowed to remain open, and these will be permitted to sell on prescriptions only. The order came following numerous complaints of citizens who are interested in the formation of a Law and Order league, and who allege that the officers have failed to do their duty.
