**RUSSIAN GENERALS ARE NOW RETIRED.**  
Fock, Smirnof and Reiss Are The Men.

St. Petersburg, April 18.—The retirement from the army for "private reasons" of Gen. Fock, Smirnof and Reiss is gazetted in the Russian Invalid. The three officers receive pensions and are entitled to wear the army uniform.

The three Russian officers mentioned in the above dispatch were, with Gen. Stoessel, the principals in the recent trial in St. Petersburg of those alleged to be responsible for the capitulation of the fortress of Port Arthur to the Japanese.
