BODIES OF BANDITS FOUND IN MOUNTAINS

Mexicans Slayed American
Ranch Owner.

El Paso, Texas, July 17.—The bodies

of Conovio Rodriguez (alias El Jor-
bado), Antonasio Keyes, and Philocar-
po Reyes, said to be noted Mexican
bandits, were found yesterday in the
mountains west of Durango, Mexico.
They were accused of the murder of
H. S. Jones, an American owner of the
San Ignacio ranch, who was killed
last May, and it is supposed they
were shot to death by rurales who had
been in pursuit of them since the mur-
der.

of Tacna and Arica, Chile, the south-

been broken and the telegraph lines
to Bolivia damaged.
