

ARRAIGNS PRESIDENT

John W. Kern Says Naming of Successor Is Hatred To Americans.

DICTATION IS NOT LIKED.

Asheville, N. C., Oct. 6.—"Patriotic men everywhere will agree with me that the third-term idea is no more hateful to the minds of the American people than that the President of this great nation shall undertake to name and dictate his own successor."

John W. Kern in these words arraigned the President and the leaders of the Republican campaign at a rally of North Carolina Democrats here.

He contrasted the course of the Republican leaders, which he described as merely an evasion of popular antipathy to a third term, with the declaration of Mr. Bryan that if elected he would not again be a candidate, and brought the audience to its feet with a eulogy of Bryan as a candidate whose nomination was "demanded by all patriotic Americans."

Mr. Kern spoke in the large Auditorium, which was crowded. The speaking was preceded by a parade of carriages and horsemen through the streets, which Governor Glenn of North Carolina said was the greatest political demonstration in this city since 1896. A feature was the presence of several hundred mountaineers on farm mules, who had ridden miles from surrounding counties to attend.

WILSON CASE IS POSTPONED

The trouble took place at a colored picnic at Jackson Park.

JOHN W. KERN THE TOOL OF GAMBLING TRUST SAYS HEARST

(Continued From Page One.)

the good corporation cow that gave her milk and to the gambling establishment which churned it into butter, and to the corrupt boss who spread the butter thick over Mr. Kern's slice of political bread.

"There is nothing that I detest so much as the old form of political controversy, in which reckless statements and unsubstantiated accusations take the place of facts.

"Depends Merely on Facts."
"Even at the risk of being dull I have in this campaign abandoned all rhetorical indulgence, all personal assertion, and have depended merely upon facts—plain facts; unvarnished court records, affidavits, documents and evidence of that character.

"In urging Mr. Kern's indisputable eligibility for the retired list, with or without a pension, rather than as a leader of the Black Horse brigade of the United States senate, I shall depend upon entirely documentary evidence.

"I shall quote only from public records and published statements and sworn affidavits.

"Mr. Kern's indebtedness to the bosses having been acknowledged, his indebtedness to the corporations is next in order.

"This association has lately been exposed through the losing and finding of Mr. Kern's railroad pass from the Big Four railroad. And it was formerly exposed by his connection with the great street railway scandals of Indianapolis during his term as city attorney.

"The finding of Mr. Kern's Big Four railroad pass is still fresh in your minds, but I will repeat the account of it as published by E. W. Hatman:

"When Mr. Kern was here at the fair," said Mr. Tatman, "he lost his notebook and spoke of his loss to several men. News of the loss came to our office, as did later a telephone message that it had been found. Anything about a national candidate is interesting, and a reporter was hurried to the scene of the find. The notebook, bearing Kern's name in gilt, was of little interest, but in it was a pass issued by the Big Four Railroad company, good until December 31, 1908, bearing the name of John W. Kern.

There Were Others.
"There were two or three other Big Four passes, but the reporter examined only one.

"A railroad official, when asked how Mr. Kern had a pass when the federal law was so sweeping against the issue of such passes, said Mr. Kern was the company's regularly employed attorney, and therefore could be given free transportation."

"Mr. Kern explained that he possesses the Big Four railroad pass merely as attorney for the railroad in damage cases against the railroad. The railroad officials declare that Mr. Kern possesses the pass as the regularly employed attorney for the corporation.

"I do not know from the data at hand which declaration is technically correct, but I do know that Mr. Kern possesses the pass and I do know that he represents the Big Four railroad and I do know that the Big Four railroad is part of the Vanderbilt system.

"You all know that the Vanderbilt system has excellent reasons for wanting one of its employees in an important position in the United States government, for you all remember that the Vanderbilt system, like the Standard Oil company, was fined by the government because of violations of the law.

"This Vanderbilt system was prosecuted by the present national administration under evidence which I myself gave to Attorney General Moody. This Vanderbilt system was convicted of giving illegal rebates to the Sugar Trust and was fined some \$110,000 and paid the fine."

"The Vanderbilt system has placed Mr. Chauncey Depew in the United States senate as the representative of the New York Central railroads, the New York branch of the system, and it would like to have Mr. Kern elected vice president as the representative of the Big Four railroad, the Indiana branch of the system.

"Mr. Kern has not only been throughout his while career the agent of privilege-seeking corporations, but he has been the legal tool of Tom Taggart in that venal boss's most corrupt enterprises.

"Mr. Kern was appointed city attorney of Indianapolis in 1899 by Tom Taggart. The administration of Tom Taggart was disgraced by one of the most outrageous street car scandals of American history. The street railway franchises of Indianapolis were given away to corporations who had corrupted the administration, as you have seen administration corrupted in San Francisco.

"Franchises Given Away."
"These franchises were given away for a mere trifle of compensation to the city for 24 years, without any provision being made for universal transfer, and the company was absolved from paying car licenses and was released from all kinds of taxes except the general taxes.

"When the indignant citizens of Indianapolis instituted action in court to nullify the franchises, Mr. Kern called one of the attorneys for the traction company to his aid, and fought the people's action and killed the people's action.

"Mr. Kern was not only Mr. Taggart's local tool in this case, but also in the gambling cases which I will now take up in detail.

"The French Lick Springs Hotel company has been sued by the state of Indiana to annul its charter. The facts averred in the complaint of the state and to be found on Page 18 are:

"That the corporation has violated its charter in the following respects:

"1. By contributing to and encouraging the delinquency of children contrary to acts of 1905, Page 44, Section 2.

"2. By violating the statutes of Indiana respecting gambling and the operation of gambling resorts.

"3. By bringing disgrace upon the community where the defendant establishment is located and upon the entire state.

"The articles of incorporation of the French Lick Springs Hotel Company shows that the incorporating members of said company are Thomas Taggart, Indianapolis, Ind.; George W. Kreitzinger, Chicago, Ill.; and Henry A. Hickman, Chicago, Ill.

CORN YIELD IS EXPECTED TO BE GREAT

Average Will Be Larger Than Last Year.

Greensfork, Ind., Oct. 6.—Some of the farmers south of town are cribbing corn and report that corn is in fine condition for harvesting, being well matured and the ears are well developed. The average per acre will be better, there not being so much soft corn as last season.

Farmers on the Walnut Level and Greensfork bottom land report that their yield will average from sixty to eighty bushels per acre and a good grade. Some of the upland corn is not out of danger of frost as yet. The cribbing of corn began three weeks earlier than last year.
