SHAW THE SPEAKER

**National Christian Endeavor
Officer Appears at
Rally.**

LARGE CROWD HEARS HIM.

William Shaw, secretary of the national Christian Endeavor organization and treasurer of the international organization, was in the city yesterday attending the Christian Endeavor rally held under the auspices of the local Christian Endeavor Union at the Christian church. Mr. Shaw is now making a tour of Indiana. He came here from South Bend and left today for Muncie.

Most of the time yesterday was devoted to the consideration of matters in connection with the administration of C. E. societies. In the afternoon and from 7 to 7:30 in the evening Mr. Shaw conducted a round table. At 6 o'clock last evening the Central Ladies Aid society gave a dinner. A large audience assembled at the church last evening and Mr. Shaw was introduced by the Rev. Conrad Huber. Mr. Shaw spoke on the significance of the Christian Endeavor movement in its international aspect.

LOST A TOENAIL AND DRANK WHISKEY

**Kereased on First Offense, But
Fined on Second.**

Levis Campbell was fined \$5 and costs in city court yesterday afternoon upon conviction of the charge of public intoxication. It was his second offense. Campbell went to jail. He was the driver of the wagon struck by a street car at Third and Main streets Tuesday afternoon. Clemency was shown Campbell by the court and newspapers upon the occasion of his first arrest. He told the reporters at that time he had had a toenail removed and drank whiskey "to ease his stomach," and took too much. He was arrested at Fifteenth and South B streets and had been found by his daughter at just about the same time he was located by a policeman. When the girl saw her father being loaded into the patrol wagon, she fought the officer and tried to secure the release of her wayward parent. She interceded with the judge the next morning and Campbell profited by her appeals. He made all kinds of solemn promises not to drink again, no matter if all his toenails were removed.

"It isn't safe to ride over those fields," was the warning of a member of a hunt to a farmer. "They belong to a disagreeable sort of fellow who might make a fuss about it."
