RAILROADS SHOWED
FAVOR TO STANDARD

Carried Oil for Less Than
They Did Oil Trust's
Competitors.

COMMISSIONS WERE PAID.

WHEN COMPETITOR SENT A BARREL OF OIL OUT OF PENNSYLVANIA, TWENTY CENTS WAS GIVEN ROCKEFELLER COMBINE

New York, Nov. 21.—Confronted by demands of Frank E. Kellogg, the government oil inquisitor, for information about the remarkable hold-up of five big railroads for rebates and for the control of the oil terminals at New York City, John D. Rockefeller, creator of the great kerosene combine, resorted to the old excuse of failing memory on the witness stand before Referee Franklin Ferris.

"I don't recollect," became one of his stock answers. "That was one of the details that I have forgotten," was another. On other subjects—some in which his testimony was favorable to Standard Oil—his memory was photographic in its exactness.

Get Pay From Rivals.

The fact was developed by Mr. Kellogg that the Erie railroad, the New York Central, the Pennsylvania, the Atlantic and Great Western and the Baltimore and Ohio carried the oil of the combine for less than it carried that of competitors.

Some of these roads actually paid "commissions," not rebates, to the Standard, and the commissions were on the shipments of oil by competitors as well as by the Standard. Every time a competitor of the Standard sent a barrel of oil out of the Pennsylvania oil region over the Erie a commission of 20 cents was paid to the Rockefeller combine; every barrel of a competitor over the Central meant the payment of 35 cents to the combine.

Vice President A. J. Cassatt of the Pennsylvania held out till the last. Daniel O'Day, one of the powers of the Standard, wrote him asking for a rebate. Cassatt did not act till the bills of the roads which gave rebates were actually shown to him. Then it was in May, 1878—he ordered the controller of his company to make out vouchers for the rebates of 20 cents a barrel.
