

## CASTRO DEPOSED BY WILY GOMEZ

New Government Established  
in Venezuela by the  
Vice President.

### OLD MINISTRY IS OUSTED

ONE OF THE FIRST TO GO WAS  
DR. PAUL WHO STARTED ALL  
THE TROUBLE WITH THE  
BLOCKADING DUTCH.

Port of Spain, Trinidad, Dec. 22.—  
Vice President J. Vicente Gomez, to  
whom Gen. Cipriano Castro handed  
over the presidency on his departure  
for Europe, has established a new  
government in Venezuela.

Gomez has replaced the old minis-  
try with a new body of men who rep-  
resent various factions in the state  
and who have figured prominently in  
various ways in the political history  
of the country. This means the end  
of the power of Dr. Jose de Jesus  
Paul, the minister of foreign affairs,  
who has been the one figure outside of  
Castro himself in the negotiations that  
culminated in the ousting of Minister  
De Reus and the severance of diplo-  
matic relations with Holland.

Dr. Baldo, who is now with Castro  
abroad, also has been removed from  
his official position as minister of edu-  
cation. Gen. Diego Ferren, the min-  
ister of war, who also was war min-  
ister in the cabinet of Acting Presi-  
dent Gomez in 1906, has been super-  
seded by Gen. Regulo Olivares, who  
took a prominent part in crushing the  
revolutionists six years ago.

Secret advices received from Cara-  
cas, where the strictest censorship is  
being observed, indicate the whole of  
Venezuela has been in a ferment since  
President Castro sailed and that the  
crisis was reached a few days ago  
when it became necessary for Acting  
President Gomez to take decisive  
steps, which he did by eliminating  
from his cabinet those who were close-  
ly affiliated with Castro.

The revolutionary factions played a  
prominent part in the demonstrations  
against the absent president, which  
took the form of rioting and incendiar-  
ism.

Letters received here tell of a plot  
to assassinate Gen. Bello, commander  
of Fort San Carlos at Faracabo. The  
conspirators were captured and shot.

All Indiana President-Makers  
Will Assemble at the  
State Capitol.

MESSENGER WILL BE SELECT-  
ED TO TAKE VOTE TO WASH-  
INGTON.

Indianapolis, Dec. 22.—The fiftieth  
presidential electors elected at the  
November election will receive their  
commissions this week from Governor  
Hanly, authorizing them to cast the  
vote of the State of Indiana for Presi-  
dent and vice-president. The commis-  
sions were issued yesterday pursuant  
to the law which provides that the  
electors shall assemble at the capitol  
of the state on the second Monday in  
January to cast the votes and dispatch  
the results to Washington to be acted  
upon by congress, in declaring who is  
elected to the office of chief executive  
of the nation. All the electors of In-  
diana are republicans.

The electors will form their own or-  
ganization, select their presiding offi-  
cer and tellers, cast their votes and  
select from their number the mes-  
senger to carry a copy of the results of  
their vote to be delivered to the speak-  
er of the house of representatives.
