### REPORT IS MADE ON FRIENDLESS HOME

At the Annual Meeting, the  
Secretary Gives Out  
Her Records.

### INSTITUTION IS THRIVING

REMARKABLE FACT SHOWN THAT  
SINCE 1904 NO DEATH HAS OC-  
URRED AT THE HOME—MAN-  
AGEMENT IS GOOD.

The report of Mrs. A. M. Taylor.

secretary of the board of trustees of the Home for Friendless, was presented at the meeting yesterday. It shows the institution to be in a satisfactory condition. It was as follows:

We are meeting for our forty-first anniversary. As we are an outgrowth of the former Y. M. C. A., having been organized by the ladies auxiliary, we think it fitting at this time, to voice our joy today over the completion and dedication of the new Y. M. C. A. and pray for its long continued usefulness and prosperity in our midst. Our home is in good condition. The trustees have improved the property by building new fences and cement walks and the minor repairs have been kept up by the two boards. We began 1908 with five adults and five children in the home department and three insane and four other prisoners in the jail. We have received during the year as new inmates three insane. Forty-one prisoners have been received, of which number five were merely held as witnesses. Children boarded by

parents or friends, 22; number of juveniles sent in by court 19; number of births 7; one was the child of a married woman; number of unfortunate girls received 7; transients 5; all with children; one had five children but was with us only a few hours. The home received one old woman. We have at this date 7 children, 2 aged women, 1 suffered from rheumatism, 1 girl boarder, 5 insane, 2 other prisoners, one unfortunate girl.

"She is more to be pitied than censured,

More to be helped than despised. She is only a lassie who ventured on the dark stormy pathway of life. Do not scorn her with words fierce and bitter;

Don't laugh at her shame and downfall;

For a moment you stop to consider

A man was the cause of it all."

The health of the home has been reported excellent. With all the different classes and ages we have in the institution, there has not been a death since 1904. Our matron is a

fine conscientious nurse as well as woman and our physician, Dr. Markley, is ever ready to respond. It will be well at this season of the year to remind the public that with all these lives in our hands, we must refuse to take contagious or infectious disease cases, as a matter of protection to our inmates. We wish to thank all who contributed to make the holidays such a happy time for us. We have granted our matron a vacation of 6 weeks that she may accept an offer to visit California with friends and wish her a happy journey.
