WARSHIP WILL GO TO AID LIBERIA

America Will Instruct the Negro Republic in Better Administration.

SHOULD GIVE PROTECTION

THIS COUNTRY'S DUTY TO ASSIST THE BLACK REPUBLIC, WHOSE GREAT FRIEND IS SECRETARY BACON.

Washington, Feb. 13.—The United States will send a warship to Liberia within the next few days and a commission will be appointed by the state department for the purpose of instructing the government with a view to better administration. Those who have watched the recession of the country say it is due to corrupt administration; that the United States has a moral duty resting upon it to impress upon Liberia that this country is interested in its welfare, and that it desires and in the development of the negro people. Secretary Bacon says the United States has developed the negro to a high standard of living and it is its duty to protect him. The U. S. consul at Monrovia, Ernest Lyon, who is a negro, says in a dispatch to the department that Liberia is entirely without funds and is much in debt which it will never be able to pay. The country has little trade with the United States. A British gunboat has arrived on the coast and a company of soldiers has been sent from Sierra Leone to Monrovia, the capital.

Manna. The manna of commerce comes chiefly from Sicily. It is a sweet substance obtained from a small tree known as the manna ash. This tree can be grown as far north as England, but in that country it yields no manna and is cultivated for ornament only. The manna is formed from the sap. The trees are ready to be tapped at the age of eight years, when the stems have a diameter of about three inches.
