SAVED LIFE ONLY IN HOTEL FLAMES

Daniel Surface and Mrs. Allee Left Clarendon Safely But Lost Possessions.

ARE NOW RETURNING HOME

IN LETTER STATE THEY INTEND TO COME HERE AT ONCE—LEFT SEA BREEZE FOR HOTEL AT DAYTONA, FLA.

Word has been received here to the effect Daniel Surface, of this city and his daughter Mrs. Jessie Allee, of Chicago, were guests at the Hotel Clarendon Sea Breeze, Florida, which was destroyed by fire Saturday night. In a letter to The Palladium, Mr. Surface writes: "My daughter and I lost everything but our lives." Mr. Surface is a former owner of The Palladium and also was postmaster previous to the appointment of Mr. Speckenhiser.

Mr. Surface and his daughter had been in Florida to spend the winter. Before going Mr. Surface's health was not very good. After being burned out at Sea Breeze he and Mrs. Allee went to the Prince George Hotel at Daytona, Florida. They now are en route home.
